The Throne of Heaven

If God is always present, where does God live? If God is truly everywhere, you can never leave His presence. If He never grows weary and does not require rest, why would He need a chair? Natural human terms are often used to describe God or identify His characteristics. The arm of God might refer to His great strength. The eye of the Lord can be used to illustrate His watchful concern.

Isaiah wrote of the Lord saying, “Heaven is my throne and earth is my footstool.” While it could be taken literally, it may also demonstrate the greatness of God. He is so vast that it requires the eternal heavens to provide a place for Him to reside. Earth serves as His ottoman!

Of course, it can also mean that all of heaven and earth is in His dominion and under His control. He is the King of Glory and the Lord over all the earth.

The truth of the greatness of God and his vast ability should inspire you with confidence that there is nothing impossible for God. You have no problem that He cannot handle, no situation of which He is not in control. Knowing the God who sits on the throne of heaven gives great faith to those on earth.
